During Christmas, you can try a special desert called bebinca, a rich multi-layered sweet dish. Goan cuisine is popular with a variety of fish dishes. Many dishes use coconut oil. Some of Goa's famous cuisines are Vindaloo, Xacutiand Sorpotel, Hathathate. They are made with different types of spices.
